Dear Councillor,

I have already met a number of you during recent months, through local induction and member development sessions or at the national Member Development network meeting in September.

I thought it would be useful to write to all Chairs of Democratic Services Committees and Member Development Champions however to remind you about support available from the WLGA.

The WLGA has a long-track record of working with members and officers in local authorities in order to improve training, development and support for councillors. We have traditionally worked closely with Member Development Champions, and will continue to do so, but recognise that Democratic Services Committees are now increasingly involved in shaping local support and resources. The recently published Local Government (Democracy) (Wales) Bill also seeks to clarify the role of Democratic Services Committees further (see Section 56).

You should hopefully be familiar with much of our support already, for example, the information we provided for prospective candidates and the Councillors guide following the elections. We have also provided over 100 workshops and training events in authorities since the elections on for example scrutiny, cabinet development, personal development review, chairing and mentoring. We also work closely with authorities to provide advice and guidance and provide local support around member development strategies and submissions for the new criteria for the Wales Charter for Member Support and Development. For further information, attached is our Member Development and Support prospectus for 2012-13. All of our support is free of charge and very much led by your authority's individual needs. All of our resources are available via our website - http://www.wlga.gov.uk/english/member-development/.

The WLGA also works with the LGA and Academi Wales in providing the Leadership Programme for elected members. Although this is fully booked for the programme starting in January, more opportunities will be available later in the year. Further information is available online at
