1. Background

1.1 Audit Committee is responsible for reviewing the effectiveness of internal control. The Financial Regulations state that it is essential that robust, integrated systems are developed and maintained for identifying and evaluating all significant operational risks to the authority.

2. Risk Management Outcomes

- 2.1 The current business planning process has identified, using the risk management toolkit (2012), the key risks facing each Service of the Council. A total of 67 risks have been placed into four categories based on the likelihood of an event occurring and the potential impact.
- 2.2 In addition, a further 20 risks where identified as being in previous risk registers that had not carried forward into current service plans.
- 2.3 Examination of the consolidated risk register identified a number of duplications i.e. where similar risks had been recorded, but in slightly different ways by multiple services. It was felt that these were corporate risks that were applicable to the majority of services. Therefore, these have been place on the risk register as a single entry.
- 2.4 Given below is a table outlining the number of risks on the revised risk register as at September 2013:
