SUBJECT: B4350, Glasbury – 40mph Speed Limit

REPORT FOR: Decision

1. Summary

1.1 Concerns have been raised regarding the number of accidents between Glasbury and Black Mountain Lodge over recent years. The Community Council have requested a 40mph buffer zone to encourage drivers to slow down before the 30mph speed limit. This should prevent the accidents caused by excessive speeds, which is the cause for the majority of the accidents along this stretch of carriageway. The Community Council have agreed to fund the consultation and implementation of the proposed speed limit

2. Proposal

2.1 It is proposed to introduce a 40mph speed limit along part of B4350 to create a buffer zone between the national speed limit and the 30mph speed limit sections. The length of the proposal is shown in the attached plan

3. Options Considered / Available

3.1 The options considered were

1. Do nothing – leave the speed limit at the existing national speed limit
2. Introduce the proposals – reduce the speed limit to 40mph to lower traffic speeds on the approach to the existing 30mph.

4. Preferred Choice and Reasons

4.1 The preferred option would be option 2. This would ensure lower traffic speeds and the risk of speed related accidents would be greatly reduced.

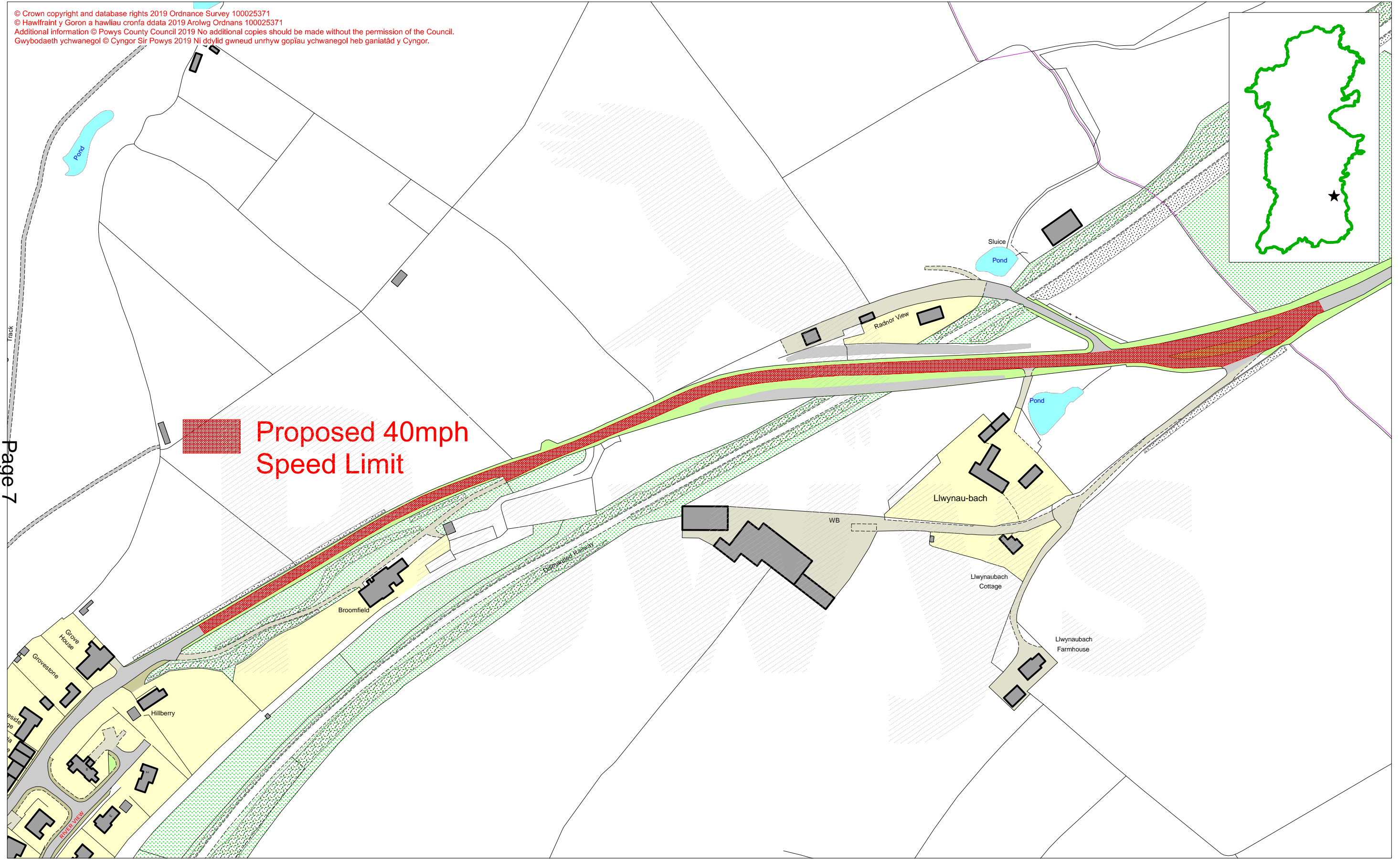
