

2. Executive Summary

Freedom Leisure commenced operation in partnership with Powys County Council (PCC) on Ist July 2015. This report covers year 5 of the contract for the 4th quarter, Ist January – 31st March 2020. These are the key headlines from this quarter and year end:

- Income has grown by 2.1% v LY (exc. mngt. fee & grants)
- Active participation +2.9% v LY
- Health Intervention participation -52% v LY
- 'Swim School' lessons +5.7% v LY
- Compliance audits achieved 99% which is a 1% increase on last year
- All sites closed March 20th due to COVID19 and in line with government instruction.

3. Financial Performance

3.1 When compared to the bid position for year 4 the contract stands with a deficit of £59.2k at the close of the year. Up until quarter 4 and as detailed in previous 2019/20 reports the contract had been performing ahead of bid. However given the forced closure of all sites in March inevitably resulted in the contract returning a deficit position at year end. A more detailed analysis for all sites can be found in the appendix.

In light of COVID19 the contract does face immediate and significant challenges. These are:

- > The withdrawal of the furlough scheme
- Operating within COVID restrictions
- Customer & member confidence
- > 50% reduction in the Free Swim Grant

Following continued discussion with PCC a number of measures are being adopted to assist the contract in facing the above challenges and to ensure the contract regains its pre covid performance.


- > To maintain open book accounting measures between PCC & FL until March 2021
- A review every month during reactivation as sites reopen during what is a most critical period.
- A review of the overall contract to take place by March 2021.
- FL to focus on reduced costs, including staffing costs and increasing income through the reopening phase
- Fees & charges to reflect the challenges highlighted above with additional increase within 12 months if required.
- A review of opening hours across the portfolio
- Flexibility as to how and when the PCC remedial / backlog fund can be accessed.
- Capital investment directed at key sites that will deliver greater access for Powys communities for a broader range of health & wellbeing services




4. Participation and Service Improvement


4.1 The 4th quarter finished +2.9% compared to the previous year.


The graphs below illustrate each of our major participation areas compared with quarter 4 in contract years 1-5.





















4.2 Aquatics

4.2.1 Swim School

Our swim school continues to remain most popular and despite no delivery for the last 2 weeks in March finished the year with 4,284 enrolled. This is +5.7% compared to 2018/19.

4.2.2 Welsh Government Free Swimming Initiative (fsi) Scheme

In 2019/20 the free swim initiative has delivered to a total of 27,724 participants in Powys. This is -31% when compared to the same period last year. This follows the Welsh Government revision of the free swim delivery with priority now being focused on 16 & under and the vulnerable within our communities. Our 16 & under utilisation has increased by 55.5% (3,043 users) whilst our 60+ provision has decreased by 25.1% (24,681users) when compared to the 2018/19 as a whole.

4.3 Powys - National Exercise Referral Scheme (NERS)

During the year the scheme has performed well and has exceeded targets despite facing significant challenges that culminated with Public Health Wales (PHW) suspending the scheme until further notice. Funding will continue to be available to pay staff costs and all incurred non-pay costs. It is essential that all areas retain their existing NERS staff under the current circumstances and PHW will support all areas to do so.

- The impact of COVID & the loss of 4 instructors during the year has been significant. When compared to the previous year this resulted in:
 - Take up decreased by 20%.
 - Completing 16 week consultations decreased by 14%
 - 52 week feedback decreased by 1%
- Machynlleth referrals was suspended from May 2019 January 2020 following the instructor resignation. The scheme grew well in quarter 4 with 22 participants.
- Recruitment has also been successful for Knighton with the service developing well with 15 active participants in Knighton.

4.4 Fresh (our family health programme targeting obesity)

Quarter 4 usage was slightly down on the previous quarters as many believed that the programme would close in March. 30 families attended the programmes which were delivered in the South and North of Powys. Attendance was strong with 97% at completion of their programme and 98% of children continuing onto our graduate programme of Junior Fitness and still participating in this 6 weeks later. 99% of participants and their families scored FRESH as a positive experience during their attendance.

The programme results evidenced that participants reduced their BMI by -0.6% and become more active on average by 1.3 days extra per week. This resulted in the reduction of their sedentary activity time by -5.9 hours.

We are pleased to have received confirmation that our bid to replace 'Fresh; with a new 'Family Fitness' programme has been successful. This will continue the excellent work achieved to date and will enable us now to extend the programme across all sites and provide an entry level for families into fitness and allow them to then access a unique fitness and health menu available in their areas of the county.

5. Asset and Environmental Management

- 5.1 Remedial maintenance works that are funded from the 2019/20 PCC Remedial / Backlog fund have been actioned, with further works submitted to PCC for consideration. Following approval of a 5-year critical replacement capital programme, other larger projects have also been started. To date a total of £250k from the remedial / backlog fund has been committed, with an additional £495k being invested from the capital fund. A summary report of all works across our sites is shared with the client on a regular basis.
- **5.2** Brecon heating system replacement completed.
- **5.3** LED lighting schemes in East Radnor Leisure Centre and Builth Sports Centre were successfully completed.
- **5.4** Sauna at Maldwyn successfully replaced with minimal disruption to aquatic delivery.
- 5.5 A summary of the electricity and gas consumption across sites for the year 2019/20 v 2018/19 evidences that electricity has decreased by 6.3% and gas by -5%. An explanation for this is listed below.

5.6 Energy Savings

- Brecon upgraded LED lighting
- > East Radnor upgraded LED lighting
- > Maldwyn sports hall LED lighting upgrade
- > East Radnor BMS replacement
- > Rhayader BMS replacement
- Powys 'energy' awareness programme for all team members
- Weekly energy monitoring

5.7 Flash ATP

Following consultation with PCC Engineering and Design services, a drainage consultant has now been appointed to undertake drainage investigations of the area and advise required remedial work. The investigations will be undertaken in February for required works to take place in the spring. Working with PCC EDS, a tender document is being compiled for the replacement playing surface.

5.8 Bro Ddyfi

Following failure of the beam and block floor at Bro Ddyfi Leisure Centre, PCC Structural Engineers have conducted inspections and will produce a report detailing required remedial work and on-going inspection regime. Consultation has also taken place with PCC Schools Service on the potential of co-locating a new leisure centre within revised plans for Ysgol Bro Hyddgen. FL are awaiting confirmation from PCC on the future of the building.



5.9 Planned Programme of Works & Outdoor Pitches Capital Bid

A revised 6-year strategic capital bid including the critical replacement of failed equipment and building fabric across the leisure portfolio has been submitted for consideration to PCC. Along with this a separate bid has been submitted for the phased replacement of all outdoor pitch facilities that form part of the contract. These proposals will ensure the Powys leisure property portfolio is maintained correctly and critical plant and equipment is replaced when required. Such investment is essential to ensure that facilities avoid closure and that the Freedom Leisure and PCC partnership continues to build on the success achieved to date.

5.10 Brecon Swimming Pool Capital Bid

As reported last quarter, Brecon swimming pool is in a poor state of disrepair and in need of significant investment to prevent a further reduction of usage and inevitable closure. A capital bid for urgent works required to the building has been submitted to PCC for consideration. Approval of this capital funding will secure provision of leisure services in the area and that the facility remains open for the foreseeable future.

5.11 Compliance

Overall compliance increased by 1% from the previous year to 99% compared to 98% in 2019.

6. Health & Safety

- 6.1 All accidents are reported through the STITCH national database system. During this reporting period there have been a total of 55 accidents which represent 0.01% of total footfall. None of these accidents were reportable.
- As has been well reported & documented we closed all facilities in March following government advice re COVID. Prior to this we worked with public health and national governing bodies in delivering our services up until we were instructed to close until further notice.
- 6.3 Our scheduled mandatory lifeguard training continued until lockdown and an example of a summary report for January 2020 can be found in the table below.
