REPORT FOR: Decision

1. Summary

1.1 Powys County Council is in the process of appointing a contractor to construct a new social housing development of 32 dwellings at Heol-y-Ffynnon, in Brecon, as part of its commitment to construct 250 new properties over a five year period.

In order to provide appropriate access to the development it has been necessary to widen the existing bus link between Cradoc Close and Maes-y-Ffynnon, which will in future allow two-way traffic to flow along this section. Planning consent has been granted for these proposals.

2. Proposal

2.1 It is proposed to revoke the existing Traffic Regulation Order which currently only allows public service vehicles to operate on a one-way basis through the section of road to allow the two-way flow for all traffic on the newly widened bus link.

3. Options Considered / Available

3.1 The options considered were

1. Do nothing – leave the road network as existing which would not provide adequate access to the development and not meet the requirements of the planning consent.
2. Introduce the proposals – and allow two-way traffic along the newly widened former bus link to provide access to the development and meet the requirements of the planning consent.

4. Preferred Choice and Reasons

4.1 The preferred option would be option 2. This would allow two-way traffic along the newly widened bus link which will serve as the access to the proposed social housing development.

1. Kerbed footpaths along both sides of the widened two-way traffic carriageway;
2. A cycle path to be included to promote active travel;
3. Safe crossing area for pedestrians to access the green space at the Wellfield;
4. Speed calming infrastructure to be built into the newly widened two-way road; and
5. A 20mph speed limit to be put in place.

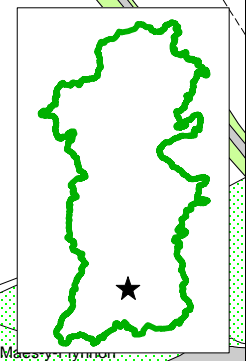

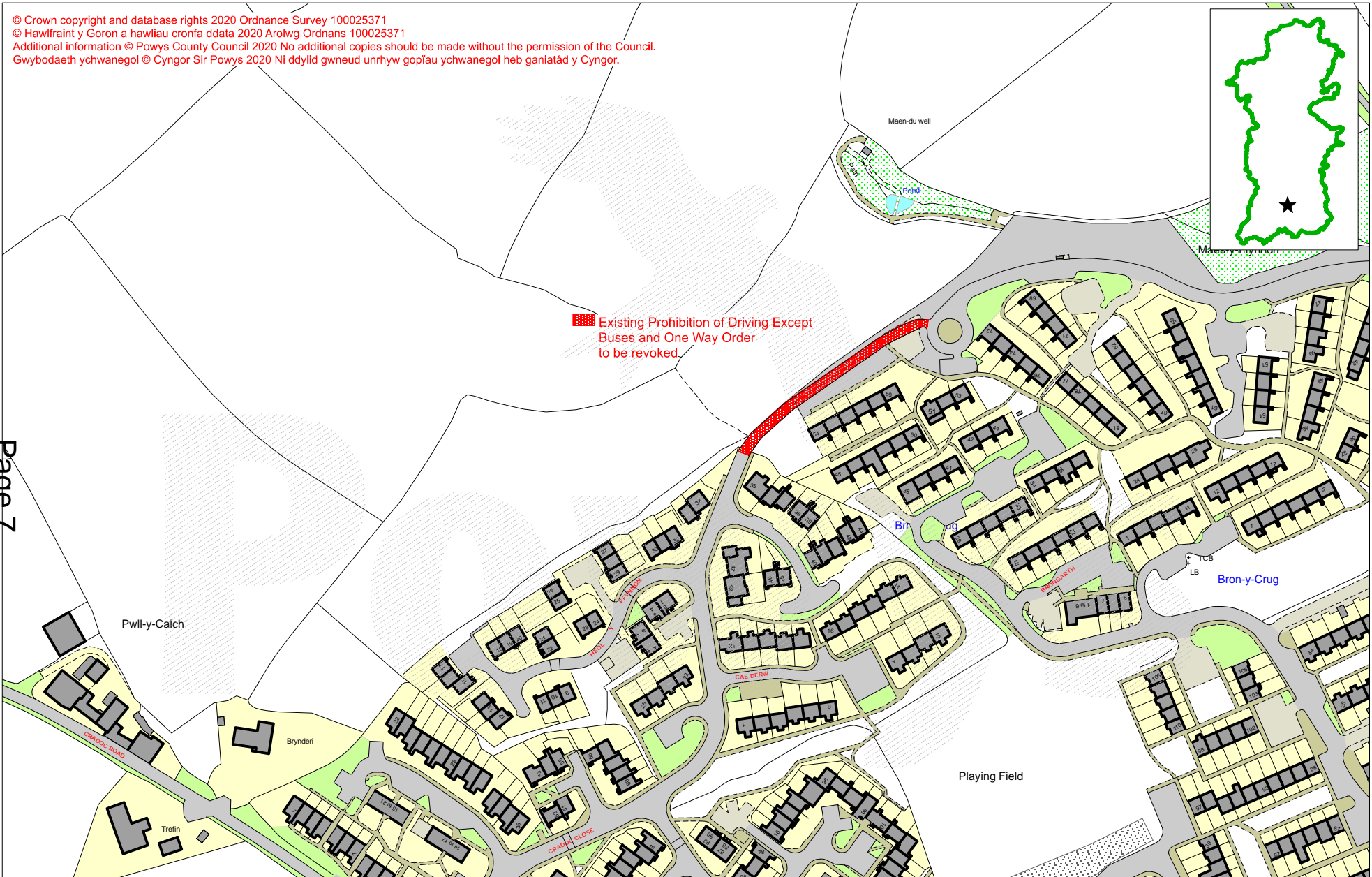
