Question:

I would like to raise an issue that has been a growing concern amongst the local community and business owners in Brecon town centre, The Watton and Ship Street areas. The pavements in these locations become extremely slippery during wet weather conditions. This has not only led to numerous expressions of concern from members of the public to local business owners but has also been a recurring topic social media over the last couple of years. My County Council ward is directly outside Brecon, but members of the public have directly asked me to raise this issue as a matter of concern.

Despite these repeated expressions of concern, it appears that no visible action has been taken to address this issue, which raises significant safety concerns for pedestrians in these areas. As such, I would like to request the Council to provide clarity and responses to the following queries:

- Has this issue been formally raised with the Council by local County Councillors? If so, what measures were advised or taken to acknowledge and address the severity of this issue?
- Can the Council confirm whether there have been any formal incidents reported or concerns raised by members of the public regarding the safety of the pavements in Brecon during wet weather in the past?
- At the time of the installation of the current paving slabs, what advice was sought and given regarding their suitability for public pedestrian use, especially in terms of slip resistance during wet weather?
- Most importantly, what plans or measures does the Council intend to implement to mitigate the slipperiness of the pavements and ensure the safety of the public going forward?

The safety of residents and visitors to Brecon is of paramount importance, and addressing this issue should be a priority to prevent potential accidents and injuries. We believe that timely and effective action from the Council will greatly enhance public safety and the overall well-being of the community.
