Services delivered for less	Leisure Services have been tasked with finding an additional £200k saving for the 2017/18 financial year. The options to transfer Llanfair Caereinion Leisure Centre to the High School could save £14,043. The transfer of the centre to the school, with the school retaining exclusive use of the facilities would result in public access being lost to the site. It would in effect mean the closure of the Leisure Centre with leisure services no longer being delivered in Llanfair Caereinion. Supporting people in the community	The proposal to close this centre would still mean that a reasonable and sufficient level of access to a range of services would be available across the county. Leisure centres deliver access to fitness classes, sporting facilities, social & community events, group and society meeting and a range of community delivered & volunteer-led services – all of which enable people to be active, engaged and live fulfilling lives. The proposal to close Llanfair Caereinion Leisure Centre to the public would mean that all of the positive impacts that Leisure Centres can have on supporting people in the community, as outlined above, would be lost for the people of Llanfair Caereinion and the surrounding area. Currently the centre offers fitness classes and sporting facilities, it can act as a social meeting point and brings community groups together. Closing the centre to the public would mean that residents would have to travel to access the activities and programmes outlined. This would not be possible for all individuals and opportunities for independence may be lost. Cabinet Report Reference:

The decision to transfer Llanfair Caereinion Leisure Centre to Llanfair Caereinion High School, with exclusive use for the school, would have negative impacts on the community. There would be reduced access to leisure facilities, reduced opportunities for improving health and well-being through being active, the removal of opportunities for social and community groups to meet, and possible job losses. At present the school have not agreed to any of the options and therefore discussions have not proceeded any further. There could be a risk in moving forward with this option without formal consultation and the involvement of the community.
