SUBJECT: Welshpool Town Primary Education

REPORT FOR: Decision

Summary

Further to the decision made by Cabinet on the 22nd November 2016, the authority published a Statutory Notice to establish a new English-medium Church in Wales (Voluntary Controlled) (C in W) Primary School and a new Welsh-medium Community Primary (CP) School in Welshpool. The Statutory Notice was published on the 25th November 2016 and the Objection Period ended on the 23rd December 2016.

This report provides information about the outcome of the statutory objection period, and includes a recommendation to proceed with the proposals for primary education in Welshpool.

Appendix A – Objection Report

Background

Formal Consultation

Formal consultation in relation to the proposals for Welshpool town was carried out in accordance with the requirements of the School Organisation Code (2013) from the 5th September 2016 to the 18th October 2016. A Consultation Report listing all issues raised during the consultation and the authority's response to them was considered by Full Council on the 18th November 2016 and by Cabinet on the 22nd November 2016.

Statutory Notice

Further to the decision made by Cabinet on the 22nd November 2016, the authority published a Statutory Notice on behalf of the authority and the Diocese which proposed the following:

From 31 August 2017:

- i) The Council proposes to discontinue the following four schools:
 - Ardwyn Nursery and Infants School
 - Gungrog Nursery and Infants Church-in-Wales (Voluntary Controlled) School
 - Oldford Nursery and Infants School
 - Ysgol Maesydre

From 1 September 2017:

- i) The Diocese proposes to establish a new English-medium Church-in-Wales (voluntary controlled) primary school that will operate initially on the current sites of Ysgol Maesydre, Gungrog and Oldford Schools, until it transfers in 2018/19 to a new school building that will be built on land at Welshpool High School;
- ii) The Council proposes to establish a new Welsh-medium community primary school that will operate initially from the current site of Ardwyn School, until it transfers in 2018/19 to a new school building that will be built on the current site of Ysgol Maesydre.

The Notice was published on the 25th November 2016 for a period of 28 days, in accordance with the guidance within the School Organisation Code.

Objections

One objection was received during the statutory objection period. The issues raised in this objection and the authority's response to these issues are listed in the Objection Report in respect of this proposal, which is attached as Appendix A.

Proposal

Having considered the objection received, it is recommended to confirm the Cabinet's decision dated the 22nd November 2016 to implement the proposals for primary education in Welshpool, as outlined above.

It is estimated that implementation of the proposal will lead to a total net annual saving of £114,110 upon the establishment of the two new schools (on the current sites) from September 2017, subject to any additional interim costs. When the schools move into their new buildings in 2018/19, it is estimated that implementation of the proposal will lead to a total net annual saving of £202,792.

One Powys Plan

'Transforming Learning and Skills' is a key priority within the One Powys Plan, and the authority's aim is to ensure that 'all children and young people are supported to achieve their potential'. The plan states that the authority needs

to 'reorganise schools (primary, secondary and post 16) to ensure affordability, sustainability and appropriate leadership capacity'.
