SUBJECT: Extended Childcare Offer Implementation

REPORT FOR: Information

1. Summary

- 1.1 Welsh Government, as part of its Employment Strategy has commenced the role out of the provision of a combined offer of universal free pre-school early year's education and extended childcare for 30 hours per week for up to 48 weeks of the year. The childcare element of the provision is only available to 3 and 4 year old children from working families, with the full rollout of the provision being achieved across Wales by September 2020.
- 1.2 Pilots for the childcare elements commenced in seven local authorities across Wales in September 2017, with further pilots expected to commence in other areas in September 2018 and within Powys from January 2019.
- 1.3 Powys County Council's response to the request for additional information and expression of interest for being part of the extended pilot (with accompanying implementation plan attached as Appendix A and B to this report). It is proposed that the rollout of the provision commences in the Maesydderwen and Gwernyfed High School catchments as the Primary School structure in each of the catchments have been designed and built with specific early year's class bases in readiness for the implementation of this initiative.
- 1.4 The authority was aware of the proposals when it commissioned the extended pre-school early years education provision from September 2017 and have anticipated that the majority of the funded settings will extend their hours of operation to meet the extended demand.
- 1.5 The authority submitted its latest child care sufficiency assessment in the Summer of 2017 and this together with the outcomes of the current review of Primary Schools capacity will be utilised to identify the available and potential capacity to deliver the extended provision,

- 1.6 As Powys currently provides 12.50 hours per week of funded preschool foundation phase education, the available funding would be based on an additional 17.50 hours per week for the 38 school weeks, and 30 hours per week for the remaining 10 weeks of the year. The funding for the childcare provision within the pilots is currently being provided at £4.50 per hour.
- 1.7 It is anticipated that the entitlement and funding procedures would be administered by a central authority, with the funding being given directly to the registered childcare provider in relation to the childcare hours. The estimated additional funding available to a childcare setting which also delivers the pre-school early years education of variable size is summarised in the table below:

- 1.8 To qualify to be in receipt of the funding the childcare provider must be registered with the Care Inspectorate Wales.
- 1.9 All funded settings are currently supported by a team of officers from the schools and CYPP Services; this support together with a commissioned business support service will support the settings in each of the authority's 13 catchment areas as the programme is rolled out over the next 2 years.

 The impact assessment will be completed following receipt of further information from Welsh Government, which is expected in May 2018.

6. Corporate Improvement Plan

- 6.1 The provision of the joint early year's education and extended childcare provision supports two of the key objectives within the Council's Vision 2025.
 - Economy the provision of the extended funded childcare provision will provide increased employment opportunities within the settings for qualified childcare staff. In addition working parents of 3 and 4 year olds will be provided access to funded places which will reduce their personal childcare costs and allow them to further support the local Powys economy.
 - 2. Learning and Skills The funded pre-school early years education provision is the first funded provision that the majority of children will have access to. The provision is a universal entitlement to all children commencing at the start of the term following a child's third birthday. There is evidence that some children in the more rural areas are not accessing the current provision due to its part time nature. The link to the extended childcare will allow parents to access full time education / childcare provision and will allow more children and parents to take up their entitlement to the pre-school education.

- 10.2 Finance The Schools Finance Manager acknowledges the additional benefits the report addresses, however, it is noted at 2.2 that further financial modelling is needed to ensure there is no cost to the authority and any additional costs in running such a scheme are fully funded as part of the scheme. We will work closely with educational officers to ensure the final proposal is endorsed by the Finance Team.
- 10.4 HR There do not appear to be any workforce implications at this stage, however, HR advice and support is available for the service area should that be required at a later stage.
