### Review of Licensing of The Old Mill Bar in Llanidloes

We are writing on behalf of our sister, Ms Cynthia Mills, who lives at No 41 High Street, Llanidloes to request a review of the licence issued to the premises known as the Old Mill Bar which lies immediately to the back of our sister's house. Our objection to the present licensing arrangement is made on the basis that two of the Council's four published licensing objectives, namely prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance, are not being achieved.

Our sister, Ms Mills, has lived at the property, of which she is sole owner, for more than twenty years. She is a single lady, 89 years old, and is now in poor health. She is therefore not in a condition to register an objection to the licence on her own behalf. Neverthless, her quality of life is being made intolerable by the noise emanating from the Old Mill Bar, and by the damage and disorderliness of customers exiting the bar, many in a state of intoxification. The back door of her property lies immediately opposite what has become the main entrance to the bar and through which customers exit. Furthermore, her property incorporates an archway which now serves as the main point of access to the bar. Apart from noisy and rowdy behaviour, there have been several instances of damage done to our sister's house and to those of immediate neighbours and even of bar customers urinating in the passageway beneath our sister's house.

The High Street, in which our sister lives, is comprised of mainly respectable residential and period properties which add much to the charm of Llandloes for which the town is well regarded. The Old Mill building is also a period property, which if properly developed and utilised, could do much to enhance the neighbourhood. We would consider it inconceivable that, if the Old Mill were to be applying from scratch for a drinking establishment today, that the Licensing board would see fit to issue a licence, given the close proximity of residential properties. What appears to have happened is that the original licence, issued to a private members club to allow members to enjoy a drink with their meal, has evolved over the years, particularly with changes of licencee, into what is now a full time drinking venue, with apparently no recognition of the change of use. We would ask that the licencing board take due note of this change of use when reviewing the licence.

Unfortunately the disturbance is happening on a very regular basis with most windows and doors of "The Mill" being open and the fire escape door, which is next to our property, being used as an entrance and exit and also as a smoking area (all of which makes the noise more apparent)

The situation is deteriorating to the stage where my tenant finds he is unable to use his kitchen or lounge areas especially on evenings when things can go on until at least 1 a.m. (or even later when there is a function on)

### Review of Licensing of The Old Mill Bar in Llanidloes
