



Mid Wales Regional Transport Plan – Engagement Plan

This Engagement Plan sets out the engagement activities that will be undertaken in developing the Mid Wales Regional Transport Plan (RTP). It sets out who will be engaged with, along with details of how, when, and why. It also provides details of what will be done with the feedback received. The Engagement Plan is a live document that will be updated as the project progresses.

In addition to the engagement identified in this Engagement Plan, the development of the Mid Wales RTP has also been informed by the results of previous engagement exercises undertaken across the region, such as the Powys and Ceredigion Well-being Assessments undertaken by the Public Services Boards.

The Engagement Plan is closely linked to the project programme, which is summarised in Figure 1. This highlights key milestones/ approval points by the Mid Wales Corporate Joint Committee (CJC) and the Welsh Government, which are also reflected in the Engagement Plan.
